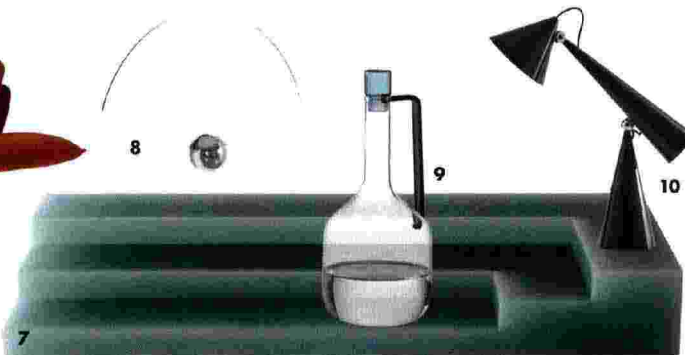

**4** Taking an even sunnier approach to the hues used on the Hoover Building is one certain way to bring a note of modernity. In this bathroom by Texas-based Kaitlyn Coffee, powder-blue tiles pair with a bespoke vanity painted in Benjamin Moore's 'Navajo Red' (kaitlyn.coffee).  
**5** It was actually an artwork depicting David Bowie that inspired the palette of this London apartment by Owl Design (set within a tower block by Foster + Partners), but the echoes with this month's architectural inspiration are clear – it's art deco put through a Memphis lens and dialled up for impact (owl.design.co.uk).  
**6** Her use of colour may be influenced by the bauhaus style, but there is an art deco quality to the geometric patterns of Elise Djo-Bourgeois. Her 'Mexique' fabric – imagined in 1930, and later reinterpreted by Pierre Frey – is used here to upholster a daybed, becoming the focal point of a notably modern interior (pierrefrey.com).
